Who we are

Tell Your Own Story **tackles the need for diversity** in the media.

We work with people whose voice isn't usually heard - people of different ethnic backgrounds, gender identities and age groups and people with disabilities.

We provide training so these stories can be told and facilitate their publication in local print, radio and digital media.

Our **aim is to reduce stereotypes** and prejudice.... through a sustained presence in local media.

Our **vision is social inclusivity** in Limerick.



Why? - our motivation

There is an increasing number of racist incidents nationwide and in the Mid-West Region.

Lack of knowledge causes stereotypes and hostility

Stereotypes are created and altered based on

- first-hand and single experiences with members of stigmatised groups,
- second-hand information from sources such as mass media, friends, and family.

Power of the media:

- Prolonged exposure to biased media content has the potential to cause highly automatic stereotypes and behaviours towards the 'Other'.

Representation of diverse groups

There is a lack of diversity of staff employed in media organisations - this leads to biased ways of portraying the 'Other'.

As a consequence, the media do not reflect the population structure and contribute to ongoing stigmatisation.



What we do

We work for a more balanced representation of the rich multiculturalism in Limerick by...

- **providing** a space for people of diverse groups to tell their story... with a focus on what we all share
- **training** members to become producers of these stories
- **collaborating** with journalists, psychologists and intercultural communication experts
- **facilitating** the publication of these stories

Working for and with the city

We put SDG 16 into practice:

- Working for local media organisations to become inclusive institutions, for access and civic participation of all.

We engage with Limerick City & County Council:

- Limerick Local Economic and Community Development Plan, INTEgreat, Limerick Migrant Forum.
